Titanium compounds are considered physiologically inert. There are no reported cases in the literature where titanium as such has caused human intoxication.

Subacute to chronic toxicity: No effects known.

Subacute to chronic toxicity:

Phosphine, if generated, is a very toxic, flammable gas. The chief effects are central nervous system depression and lung irritation. Inhalation can cause coma and convulsions leading to death within 48 hours.
